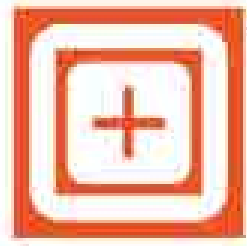

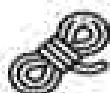

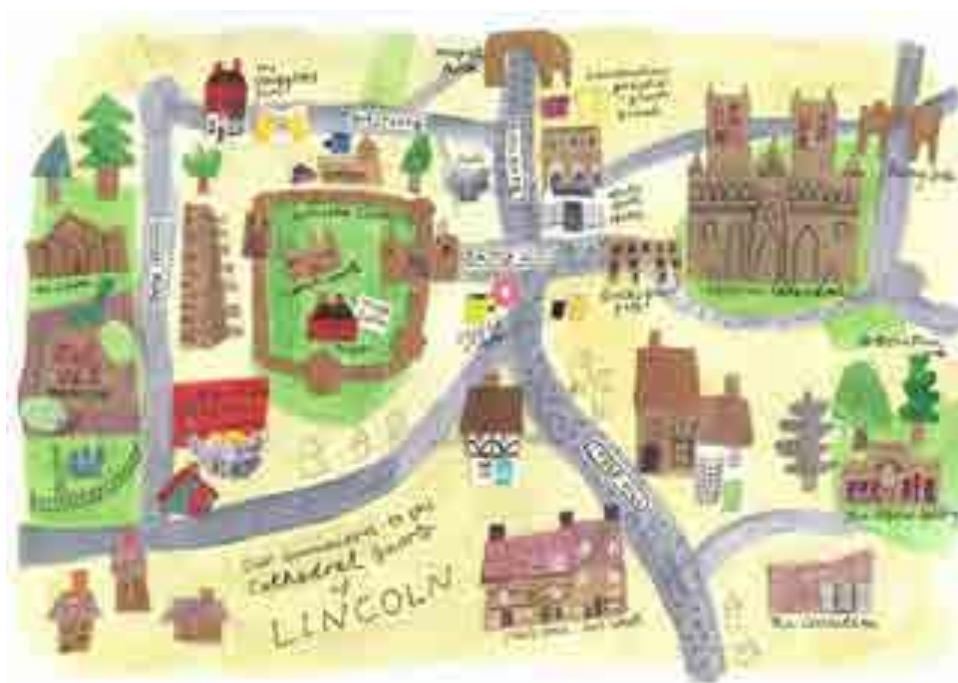

Team registration details

Registration for all competitors, will take place between 1400-1830 hours on Thursday 14 September at the Engine Shed. Please note the names of all team members will need to be logged. Charged parking is available at the Engine Shed, accessed via Rope Walk.

Those team members unable to register their arrival at the Engine Shed prior to the Opening Ceremony, should attend the registration area at the Castle (Heritage Centre) on the Friday morning (open from 0715 hours). Water challenge competitors unable to attend the Opening Ceremony can register at their challenge location at Newark.

Teams will also need to register to compete in their respective challenges at the time and location indicated on their timetable. In the case of extrication and trauma this will be at the Heritage Skills Centre within the Castle grounds.

Information for competitors

All event related activities should be undertaken in accordance with the respective Fire and Rescue Service's safe working procedures, whilst also following UKRO/LFR risk assessments produced for each challenge activity/environment. Where there is considered to be conflict or inconsistency between a Fire and Rescue Service's procedure and an UKRO/LFR risk assessment, the relevant Service is responsible for bringing this to the attention of UKRO/LFR in advance of participating in an event.

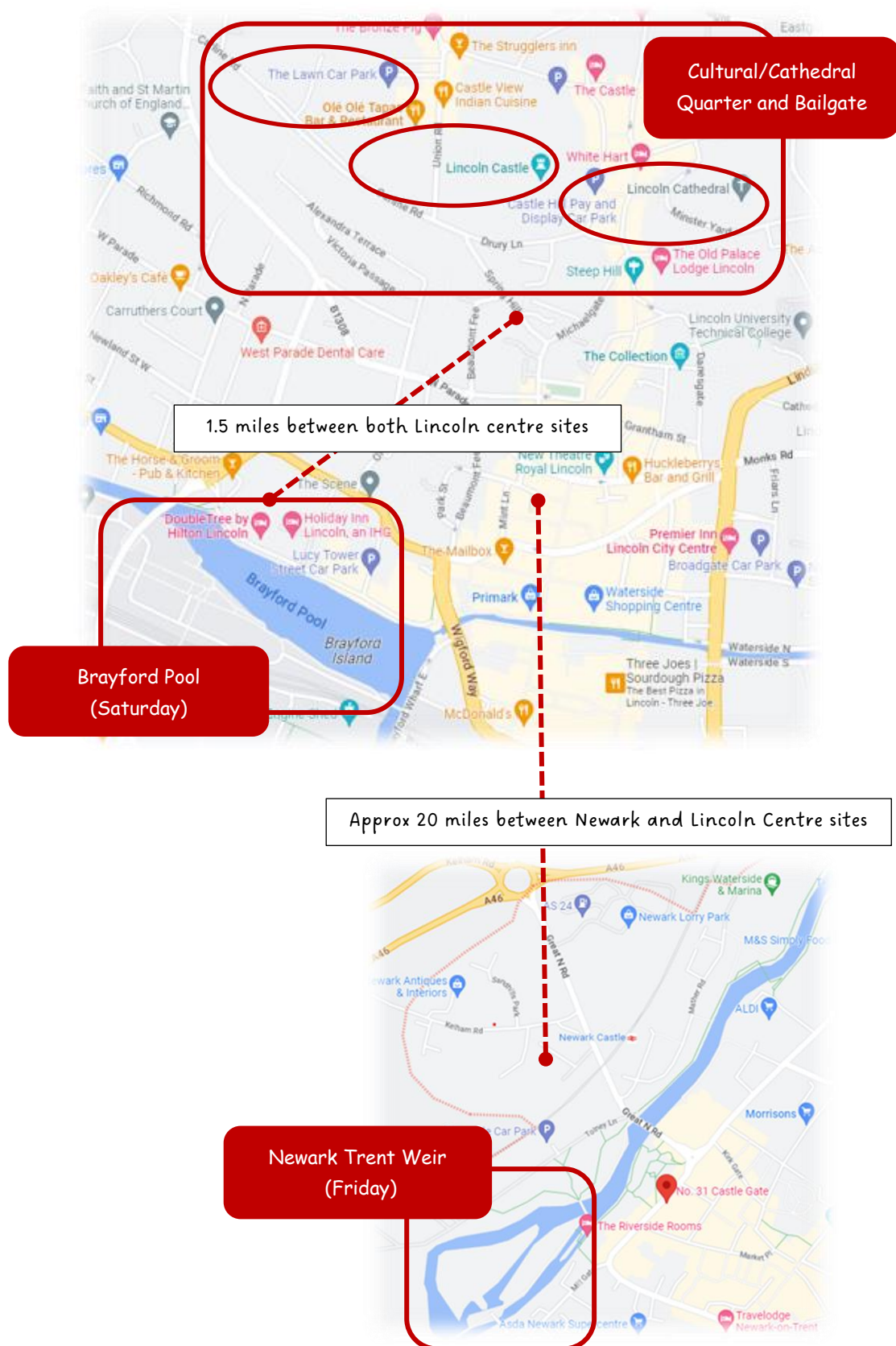
Competing Services are responsible for ensuring their participating personnel are provided with their Service's relevant safe working procedure and UKRO/LFR risk assessment information prior to participating in the event and operate in accordance with the information and instructions contained within Service-related safe working procedures, UKRO/LFR risk assessments and associated event safety briefings.

In the event of a competing Service having any concerns relating to risk assessments or health, safety or welfare, they should raise their concerns with UKRO/LFR to enable the matter to be investigated and where necessary remedied.

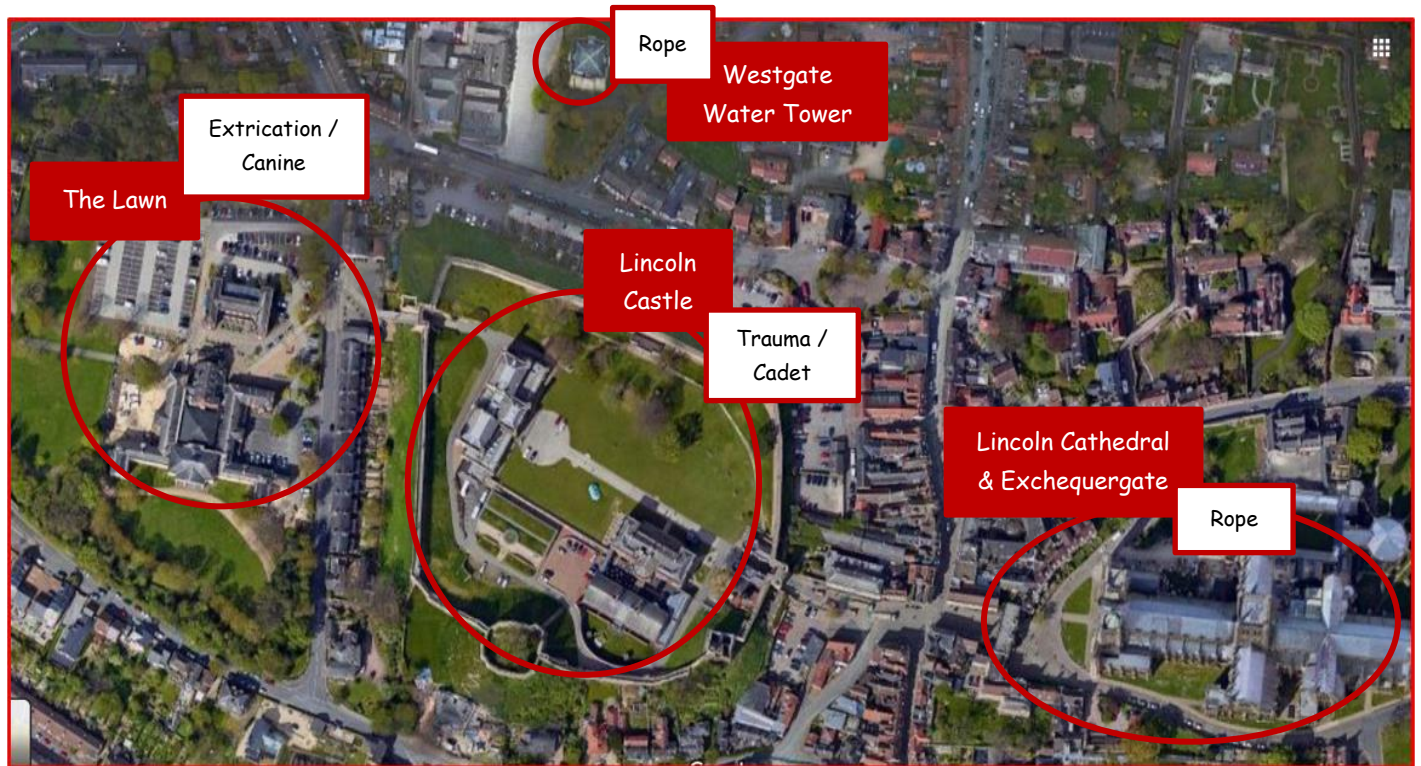

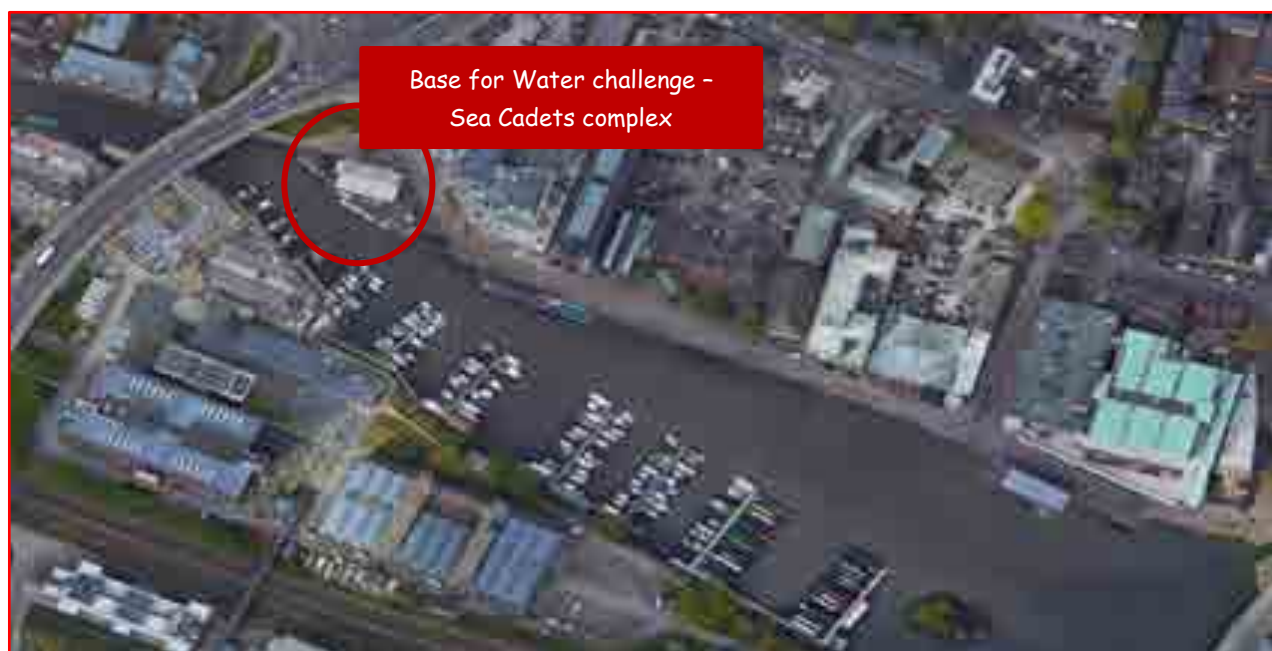

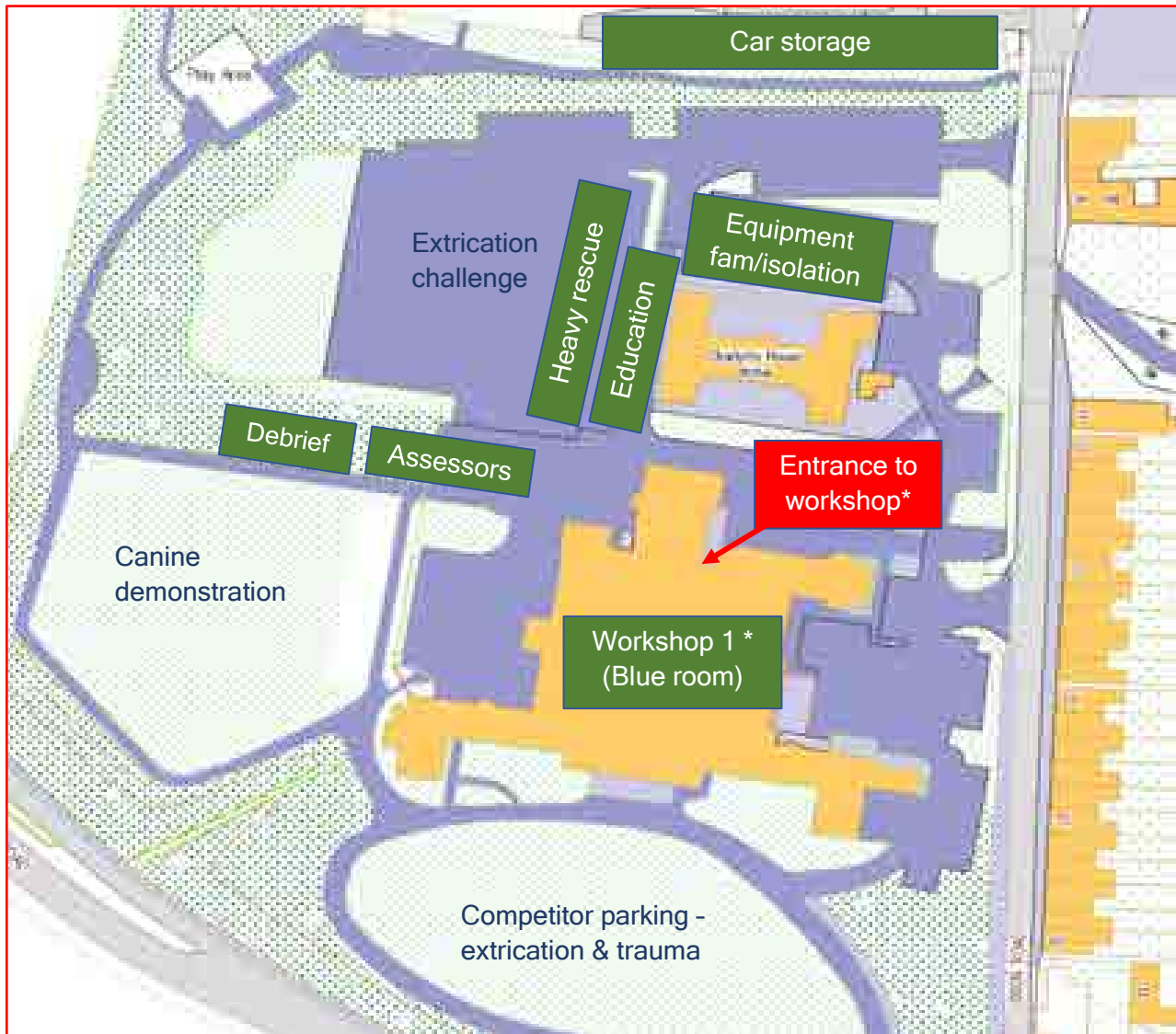


Water - Saturday (Brayford Pool)

Car parking

Parking is available at various locations close to the Challenge sites, available from Thursday, 1200 hours onwards. To ensure we can accommodate as many teams/competitors as possible, specific areas have been identified for certain event groups. **To gain access to your designated car park you will need to show your relevant parking permit to event staff (see last page of this pack).**

As the amount of space is limited, for your assistance we are providing marshals to oversee the parking areas to ensure we can accommodate as many vehicles as possible. Where possible please travel together to reduce the amount of parking required which will ensure space is available for all. Timetable

To ensure you arrive at your event and workshops at the appropriate time, please keep your event timetable to hand. Those competing in the Extrication and Trauma challenges will need to report in advance to the registration point at the Castle Heritage Centre at the time indicated on your timetable. Please note the workshops connected with the event are compulsory.

With regard to the HGV activity, there is an option whether to complete this as a workshop or as a challenge. Both teams to decide on preferred option.

Those teams competing in the rope challenges should register for their event adjacent to the main entrance of the Cathedral. Registration for the water challenges will be at the respective challenge locations. Cadets Teams should report to the Castle Heritage Centre at 0830 hours on the Saturday.

Photography

Photographs and video footage will be taken throughout UKRO 2023. Taking part in this event will be taken as agreement that this may be used in publicity during and post event by both Lincolnshire Fire and Rescue and/or UKRO for publicity purposes, during and post event on social media and promotional materials, and may also be published on our website.

If you do not wish to appear in any images, please make yourself known to the event marshals, or official photographers, so that appropriate steps can be taken to ensure you are not included in any photography.

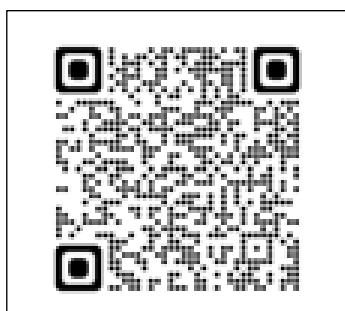

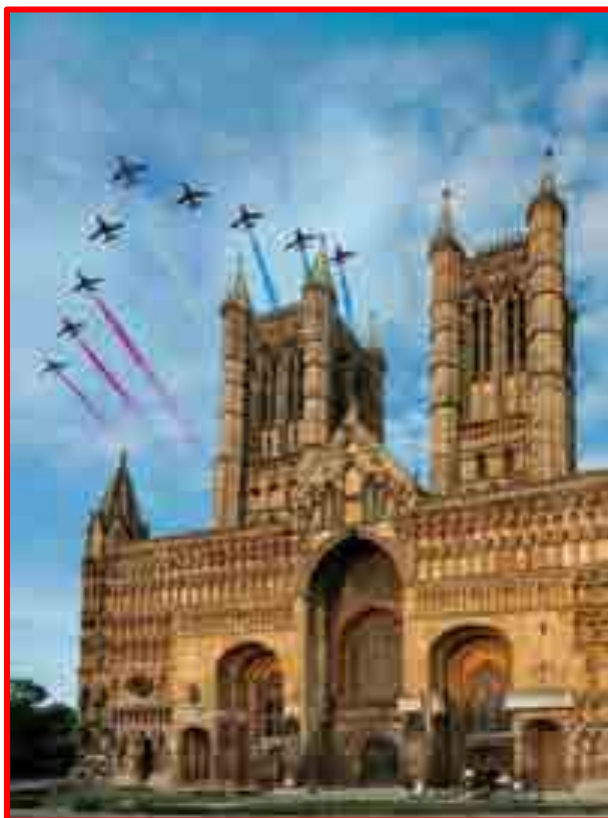
